

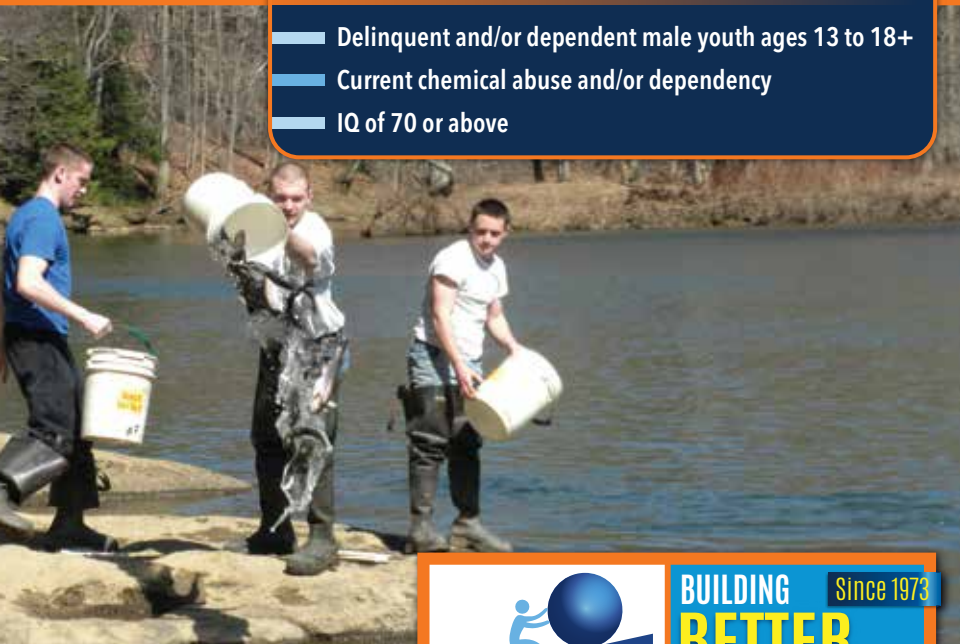
ABRAXAS | PROVIDES A SAFE, NURTURING, AND STRUCTURED ENVIRONMENT FOR delinquent and/or dependent male youth to **MAKE POSITIVE CHANGES IN THEIR BEHAVIORS, ATTITUDES AND BELIEFS.**

Our Goal is to ELIMINATE drug abuse/dependency and delinquency, and DEVELOP competencies that will enable our youth to function as responsible members of the community.

Residents participate in a variety of therapeutically structured activities including individual counseling, group counseling, family counseling, clinical study, AA/NA groups, life skills education, recreation and volunteer work in the local community. Treatment planning integrates the concepts of Balanced and Restorative Justice by focusing on offense specific counseling, victim awareness, accountability and competency development.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Delinquent and/or dependent male youth ages 13 to 18+
- Current chemical abuse and/or dependency
- IQ of 70 or above



HIGHLIGHTS

- Highly structured clinical schedule which includes primary care services delivered by drug and alcohol professionals
- Individual and group counseling
- Group Counseling topics to include: Drug and Alcohol Treatment and Recovery; Conflict Resolution; Anger Management; Social Skills Training; HIV Education; Problem Solving; Cognitive Restructuring; and Life Skills (including competencies identified in the Casey Life Skills curriculum)
- On and off site NA/AA Groups
- SITCAP (*Sensory Interventions for Traumatized Children Adolescents and Parents*)
- Gun violence prevention
- Family sessions
- On grounds, privately licensed middle and high school offering the following: The opportunity to earn credits that can be transferred to the home school; high school diplomas; GED prep and testing; credit recovery; SAT prep and testing; and online college courses
- Career and technical education opportunities: Abraxas I is affiliated with the Pennsylvania Academic Career/Technical Training Alliance and also partnering with OVR (*Office of Vocational Rehabilitation*)
- Restitution and community service opportunities
- Interscholastic/intramural athletics, music, art and numerous clubs available
- Outpatient trauma focused therapy (*as deemed necessary*)



The Intensive Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program for Boys is a service of Abraxas I, licensed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Health, Division of Drug and Alcohol Program Licensure and Department of Human Services, accredited by The Joint Commission and partnering with the Sanctuary Institute for clinical and organizational change.

Fully funded by Managed Care for Pennsylvania youth who meet the requirements for this level of treatment (ASAM Level III.1 or III.5). Managed Care Organizations include CBH, PerformCARE, CCBHO, MHS and VBH.
